## AN ABSENCE OF GRATITUDE Rom 1:18-23

### 1. God's wrath is being revealed.

- **a.** Against all the godlessness and wickedness of people who suppress the truth *by* their wickedness.
- **b.** Why? Because the truth is staring them in then face. Plainly.
- Something does and can not come from nothing. Creation points to the Creator.
- Our world has His "fingerprints" all over it. (Ps 19:1-4a)
- Those who reject the evidence are culpable. No excuses!

### 2. Although humanity instinctively knows God, it largely rejects that knowledge.

- **a.** They neither give Him glory or thanks.
- **b.** Their thinking has become futile and their hearts darkened.
- **c.** They make claims to wisdom but are actually fools.
- They worship created things rather than God.
- They worship themselves (and in so doing degrade themselves).
- They prefer the lie to the truth.
- Go where you will in this world, everywhere people worship something.

## 3. Therefore God gave them\* over to their sinful desires (vs 24, 26, 28). (Depravity)

- **a.** To self gratification and mutual degradation. (It all stems from self-worship: Ez 16:49-50, 2 King 17:5, Lk 12:16-21).
- **b.** They overflow with all kinds of nasty stuff: (See also 2 Tim 3:1-5, 4:1-5)
- c. They not only practice this rebellion, but approve of those who do it.

## 4. Lk 6:35-36. - How does God act towards the ungrateful? How are we to act?

- a. It's a sign of the times. Probably at any time. 2 Tim 3:2
- **b.** How are we to be different? Ex 23:4-5, Lk 6:27-36
- To not respond in kind.
- To be merciful as our God is merciful. He is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

#### 5. Are we grateful (and to the right Person)? Deut 8:10-18

- a. What do we have that we haven't received? (1 Cor 4:7, 1 Pet 4:10)
- The Israelites offered to God the firstfruits of their flocks, herds and produce. E.g., Ex 22:29, 23:19, Deut 26:1-15, Prov 3:9-10, the idea seeming to be to acknowledge our dependence on Him. To honor Him for our increase.
- We are called upon to, *in view of God's mercy,* to offer Him our very selves. (Rom 12:1, 1 Cor 6:10)
- **b.** Heb 13:15-16. Be thankful and generous.

Ingratitude leads us to self/false worship and judgment.

Gratitude leads us to worship, dependence on God and to compassionate ministry.

\* "Them" refers to those who reject and suppress the truth about God and engage in false worship.

# LOOKING BACK Deuteronomy 8:1-20

#### 1. Be careful to follow God's commands

vs 1

- a. That you may enjoy His favor and blessing. (Jn 14:21, Gal 5:19-23, 2 Tim 3:17)
- **b.** That you might possess what He has promised. (It isn't ever ours by right.).
- 2. Remember how God has led you over time (at this time it had been 40 years). vs 2-5
- **a.** To humble and to test you. We are works in progress! (Phil 3:4b-14)
- **b.** He withholds things but also blesses. He is our Shepherd (Gen 48:15, Ps 23).
- To teach us that there is more to life than "bread."
- To teach us that He is the bread of life (Jn 6)
- To teach us to depend on His provision and word.
- To teach us to trust His discipline and shepherding. (E.g., Heb 12:4-13)

## 3. If you trust Him, follow Him.

vs 6-20

- **a.** He will care for us (Mtt 6)
- **b.** When we eat and are satisfied, do not forget Who provides.
- Adversity will usually draw us near, not prosperity. But from our vantage point, it can be tough. But we need to remember His faithfulness. (Ps 119:75, Lam 3:19-36)
- When things go "our way" it can be easy to drift. We can forget the lessons learned in the hard times.
- Remember Who gives us the ability to live and prosper.
- **c.** Don't forget Him. If we do, it *will* end well but not until we have learned. A look in the "mirror" can be a healthy thing! (Ecc 12)

What can we thank Him for today regarding:

Our salvation? What is the alternative?

Our provision? What does He promise? (Mtt 6:25-34/1 Tim 6:6-8)

Our relationships? How have they enriched us?. (Phil 2:1-4)

Our confidence? How has it comforted us? (Jn 5:24, Rom 5:1-5, 1 Jn 5:13)

For what else can we thank Him? (Job 1:13-22, Eph 5:20, 1 Thes 5:18)
